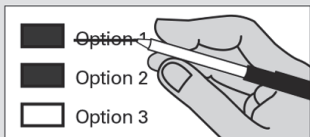

The Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 760 concerning a proposition for a replacement levy for educational programs and operations. This proposition provides funding for educational programs and operations expenses not fully funded by the State. If approved, Proposition 1 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, on all taxable property within the District, as provided in Resolution No. 760.

Bonds to Construct and Improve School Facilities

The Board of Directors of Kalama School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 2017/18-04, concerning a proposition to relieve overcrowding, improve educational opportunities and safety. This proposition would authorize the District to: construct a new elementary school to replace the existing Kalama Elementary School; construct a new middle school addition adjacent to Kalama High School; acquire and install air conditioning at Kalama High School; issue no more than \$63,405,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 25 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2017/18-04.

Replacement of Expiring Educational Programs and Operations Levy

The Board of Directors of Kelso School District No. 458 adopted Resolution No. 2017/18-08, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operations. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, for educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State of Washington, including teaching and support staff, smaller class sizes, instructional materials, maintenance, athletics and student activities:

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**Kelso School District No. 458  
Proposition 2**

Bonds to Construct and Renovate School Facilities and Improve Safety

The Board of Directors of Kelso School District No. 458 adopted Resolution No. 2017/18-09, concerning a proposition to relieve overcrowding and improve infrastructure and safety. This proposition would authorize the District to: construct three new elementary schools; make District-wide safety improvements; renovate and expand Butler Acres, Rose Valley and Huntington Schools; renovate Carrolls, Coweeman and Kelso High Schools; renovate the stadium and other athletic facilities; refinance the bond issued to acquire land; issue no more than \$98,600,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2017/18-09.
